

Inspired after Arshay Cooper's memoir of the same name, A Most Beautiful

What is A Most Beautiful Thing about?

Thing chronicles the formation of the first all-Black high school rowing team in the United States. Set in the 1990s, five young men from rival gangs in the West Side of Chicago put aside their differences and begin rowing together. Through a compilation of interviews, viewers learn that while the teammates initially agreed to go to the first meeting because free pizza was offered, they stuck together for a greater reason. Out on the water, the group could momentarily forget about their lives marked by violence, poverty and discrimination.



"We were able to get rival gang members together in a single boat. We hated each other, and we became like brothers," Arshay told The Atlantic. "[Rowing] took me out of the neighborhood for a while. I could focus on the person sitting


in front of me, and the person behind me, on developing that magical rhythm,


